2022 SEASON

In 2022 we are celebrating a phenomenal 50 year legacy of bringing young people together to create challenging and intelligent theatre. We have put together one of our biggest artistic programs ever, including three world premieres, and revisiting an Australian classic that started right here.

To kick off our 50th anniversary, we're going back to the 1980s with *Dags* by Debra Oswald. Commissioned by Canberra Youth Theatre in 1985, and now one of Australia's most popular plays for young people ever, *Dags* is an hilarious, quirky journey through adolescent anguish, the struggle to be popular and the need to be true to yourself, all set in the coolest/cringiest decade of all time.

The Initiation by Cathy Petocz is a new play created with our young artists, exploring the horrors of the early teen experience, the deep fears young people face journeying into adulthood, and the spiritual site of Black Mountain.

We're back in The Playhouse with a new commission, *How To Vote!* by Julian Larnach. This epic comedy unveils the treacherous political landscape of university life, set amongst a cut-throat election campaign, filled with ambitious student politicians, journalists, and theatre-makers, all fighting to make it to the top.

We finish the year with the world premiere of *Soul Trading* by Kate Walder, where our youngest artists will take us over 50 years into the future, to a world where humans are created with gene selection technology, Artificial Intelligence is everywhere, and children's best friends are robots.

But that's just the beginning! There's also our Emerging Artists program, workshops, plus a bunch of new initiatives for young and emerging theatre makers to get involved in.

This is Canberra Youth Theatre in 2022. Our 50th year promises exciting opportunities for young artists, sophisticated productions for our audiences, and a bold vision for our future.

From our early beginnings as Canberra Children's Theatre, through the Youth Theatre Workshop years of the 1970s, and decades more as Canberra Youth Theatre, we are now one of the leading youth arts companies in Australia.

In 1981, Canberra Youth Theatre moved from its first home at Reid House to Gorman Arts Centre where we are still a resident company, and have since collaborated with thousands of young artists through productions, workshops, creative developments and community events.

As an ACT Key Arts Organisation, we have created work across all of Canberra: in our major theatres, public spaces, and national cultural institutions. We have toured around the country, and internationally.

I'M GOING TO ADMIT SOMETHING I NEVER THOUGHT I'D ADMIT TO ANYONE Ever. I've got a crush on adam. Head over heels. Uncontrollable passion... Unrequited passion, of course... I know he'd never go for a dag like me.

Gillian is 16. She's interesting, erudite, soulful, romantic... and she's a dag. I mean, *daaaaaaag*! She's a misfit, an outcast, a chocolate addict, on a desperate quest to be beautiful and popular. Oh yeah, and she's hopelessly in love with Adam – and I mean hopelessly – like, a negative vacuum of sub-atomic non-hope.

Follow Gillian's pursuit of romance and happiness, as she navigates overbearing sisters, schoolyard politics, head-over-heels crushes, and first kisses, to discover that maybe finding out who you really are isn't so bad after all, even if you are a dag.

Dags is an excruciatingly funny and compassionate journey through the world of adolescent anguish. Originally commissioned by Canberra Youth Theatre in 1985, it has become one of the most definitive and popular Australian plays for young people ever. Of course, life as a teenager has changed so much since the 80s... hasn't it?

Whether you're living it for the first time, or have been reliving it ever since, *Dags* is the ultimate show about the awkward glory of never fitting in, 'cause who the hell would even want to?

THERE'S A PLACE IN THE BUSH BALANCED BETWEEN STONE, SKY, WATER. Past stars sending ancient light. You'll find what you need for the initiation And you will come out changed.

A double-dare draws six seemingly normal teenagers into the twilight bush of Black Mountain. As night falls and time keeps shifting around, they realise they are lost. When a knife keeps turning up, despite their efforts to get rid of it, they fear they'll never come out alive.

The Initiation is about the horrors of the early teen experience; that uncanny period between childhood and fully becoming an adult, and the scary things you

But behind the three-word slogans and noncore promises lies an underbelly of secret deals and divided loyalties, corruption and ambition; all designed to win the hearts and minds of the student body.

Following an entire election cycle within a prestigious university, *How To Vote!* explores the treacherous political landscape of campus life, and what happens when you put the word 'student' before journalism, politics and theatre.

Commissioned by Canberra Youth Theatre, this world premiere whip-smart political comedy is set in an election year (topical!) in a city that's definitely not Canberra (it's totally Canberra!).

Featuring a massive ensemble cast of university-aged artists, *How To Vote!* smashes together *Secret City* and *Sex Education* in an epic exploration of power and what it takes to wrestle it from your enemies' cold, dead hands - all while scraping through your end-ofsemester exams.





WORKSHOPS

Find your voice. Explore your craft. Share your story.

Our workshops bring young people together to think imaginatively, express themselves artistically, and discover the joys of performance.

We treat young people as artists in their own right, empowering them to find their own unique voice and share their stories.

We create a space for young people to connect, collaborate and belong. We bring them together with professional artists to discover new skills, build self-confidence and learn how to make theatre in a supportive and encouraging environment.

Our Workshop Artists are professional theatre-makers who are passionate about collaborating and creating work with young people. Together they make exciting work that challenges us to see the world from new perspectives.

Our weekly Ensembles are semester-long programs that run in line with school terms. Participants learn a wide range of skills across many performance styles, creating an end of semester showcase performance for family and friends.

Whether you are considering pursuing a professional career in the arts, or simply want to expand your skills, make new friends, and have fun, Canberra Youth Theatre is a safe, inclusive space for all young people to be creative, share their voice, and explore their passion.

In 2022, we will be delivering our workshop programs at Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres, Belconnen Arts Centre, The Q - Queanbeyan Performing Arts Centre, and in Gunghalin.

PRIMARY YEARS 1 - 3

Discover and delight in the joys of theatre. Young people explore creative play and storytelling to free their imagination, build skills in collaboration, confidence and creative problem solving. This introduction to performance enables young artists to invent themselves, find their voice, and share their story by creating an original piece of theatre and presenting it to friends and family.

YEARS 4 - 6

Explore the foundations of theatre making and performance. Young artists collaborate with professional theatre makers to develop their skills in improvisation, creating characters, devising new stories, voice and movement, collaboration and creative thinking. This opportunity to discover specific performance techniques provides young people with a space to express themselves, learn the fundamentals of stagecraft, and empowers them to share their stories. Young artists develop and present an original piece of theatre for an audience of their family and friends.



SECONDARY

YEARS 7 - 9

Establish a toolkit for theatre making. Young artists collaborate with professional theatre makers to develop skills in acting, improvisation, devising, script analysis, character development and stagecraft. Through a practical exploration of many and varied performance styles, young artists take ownership of their craft, hone their creative voice, and become confident theatre makers. Young artists collaborate to devise and present an original performance piece for their friends and family.

YEARS 10 - 12

Initiate a pathway to professional creative practice. Young artists delve deep into the theatrical process, exploring sophisticated acting and theatre making techniques. Ideal for dedicated drama students to expand their understanding of theatre making and refine their personal creative practice. Weekly exploration of new acting techniques and methodologies sharpens skills in acting, devising, voice, movement, stagecraft, monologues and scene work. Young artists perform scenes from plays, devise their own works, and collaborate on an original performance to hone their craft and establish their practice as emerging theatre makers.

SCHOOLS PROGRAM

We work with primary schools across the ACT to provide quality after-school drama programs. Participants work with a professional Workshop Artist on a weekly program that builds creativity and confidence through collaboration, improvisation, and performance. They discover new skills, express themselves creatively, and work as an ensemble to create a performance at the end of the term for their family and friends at their school. HOLIDAY PROGRAMS

We deliver fun and engaging theatre workshops during school holidays for young people in Years 1-12. Primary aged programs engage and stretch the imaginations of young people as they discover new skills, create characters, tell stories, make new friends, build confidence, learn about performance, and most of all have fun in a collaborative and supportive environment.

Secondary aged programs offer specialised intensives that develop performance skills and introduce young artists to new techniques in areas such as devising, scenework, movement, auditions, screen acting, musical theatre, and much more.

This program is for emerging artists eager to discover creative skills, define their own artistic practice, and gain practical tools to build a sustainable career in the arts.

The Emerge Company will work together to create a dynamic new work, and collaborate on a range of additional artistic projects across the company. The Emerge Company showcases the work of our most promising emerging theatre makers.

MASTERCLASSES

Join us throughout the year for a series of specialised masterclasses with leading industry professionals. These programs connect emerging creatives with the arts sector through intensive workshops exploring a diverse range of disciplines. Our masterclass programs provide practical training for emerging artists looking to develop their skills and collaborate with professionals arts practitioners in a challenging and supportive environment. Programs include:

DIRECTING INTENSIVE

This new program offers emerging theatre makers the opportunity to discover the skills and processes necessary for a theatre director. Working with Artistic Director Luke Rogers, over eight sessions participants will explore the dramaturgical aspects of directing, discover how to analyse the action of the text, unlock the creative ideas within a play, develop production concepts, collaborate with designers, and successfully work with actors. This masterclass empowers emerging theatre makers to discover the kind of director they want to be, understand the type of work they want to create, and gain the confidence to realise their artistic vision.

DRAMA SCHOOL AUDITION MASTERCLASS

Thinking of applying for drama school? Join us for an intensive workshop series specifically focussed on the unique experience of the drama school audition. Gain insider knowledge on the audition process, receive guidance on selecting your monologues, learn how to approach both classical and contemporary pieces, and develop confidence and spontaneity in taking direction during the audition. This masterclass is ideal for young actors who are applying to drama schools, or who simply want to learn how to prepare for the challenges of an audition, so you are equipped to do your best work.

WRITING

YOUNG PLAYWRIGHTS PROGRAM

Canberra Youth Theatre's Young Playwrights Program is for emerging writers aged 16-25 years to develop their skills in writing for performance.

Led by professional playwright Mary Rachel Brown, with mentorship from professional industry guests, writers will be encouraged and supported to experiment and develop their voice as playwrights through a series of creative, practical workshops.

Young playwrights will explore creative processes to develop their writing, receive dramaturgical support, have their scripts workshopped with our Resident Artists and an ensemble of actors, and see their work performed.

This program offers young and emerging playwrights the opportunity to be part of a collaborative network with other artists, learn new skills, discover their voice as a writer, unlock creative possibilities, and create new works for performance.

EMERGING PLAYWRIGHT COMMISSION

The Emerging Playwright Commission offers a professional commission to an emerging Australian playwright, to create a new full-length work that brings the voices and stories of youth to the stage.

Canberra Youth Theatre is committed to investing in the creation of new Australian plays for young people. This initiative places emerging playwrights at the centre of the creative process, and is specifically designed to springboard writers at a crucial point in their career.

The successful writer receives ongoing dramaturgical support, collaborates with an ensemble of young emerging artists, participates in a series of creative development workshops, and sees their script come to life in a staged reading of their work.

Our 2021 Emerging Playwright Commission recipient is Joanna Richards.

"I am overwhelmed and ecstatic to receive this commission which will offer me an enormous opportunity to develop as a playwright. To write material for young people – about what is arguably one of the most formative times in any person's life — is such a gift.
