DAWN KING | PLAYWRIGHT

Dawn King is an award-winning writer working in theatre, film, TV, radio and other forms. *The Trials* had a sold-out English language premiere at the Donmar Warehouse in 2022, after a German production at the Düsseldorfer Schauspielhaus, and was a finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize 2021. Her play *Addictive Beat* had an immersive production in a converted church in Southwark Park in September 2022 (with Boundless theatre). Her radical reinterpretation of *The Cherry Orchard* for director Katie Mitchell opened at the Deutsches Schauspielhaus Hamburg in November 2022. She is currently adapting *The Trials* for the screen with Firebird Pictures, working on the feature film *Pig Child* for Delaval Film and the BFI, and adapting

her play *Foxfinder* for the screen with Elation Pictures and Film Four. Dawn's previous work for the stage includes *Foxfinder*, originally produced by Papatango Theatre Company at The Finborough in 2011 and revived in a West End production at The Ambassadors in 2018, *Brave New World* (Royal and Derngate) *Ciphers* (The Bush) and *Salt* (National Theatre Connections.) She co-created immersive rave *Dystopia987* for Manchester International Festival 2019. For *Foxfinder*, Dawn won the Royal National Theatre Foundation Playwright Award 2013, Papatango New Writing Competition 2011 and Most Promising Playwright, Off West End awards 2012. She was a finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize 2012 and the James Tait Black drama prize 2012. Dawn's short film *The Karman Line* won 17 awards including the BIFA for Best Short and was BAFTA nominated in 2014. Dawn teaches playwriting and screenwriting to adults and teenagers at City Lit, National Theatre, Central School of Speech and Drama and elsewhere, and works as a dramaturg and script editor.

DIRECTORS NOTE

We are thrilled to be opening our 2023 season with the Australian premiere of *The Trials*. There isn't a more pressing, urgent and relevant play for us to be producing with our young artists and presenting for our audiences here in Australia's political centre. The artists of our nation's capital have a unique responsibility to reflect the political moment, and our young artists take that responsibility personally.

In 2018 Patrick entered the world of theatre, acting as musical director for ANU's Arts Revue. Since then, he has reprised this role as well as composing music and designing sound for several theatre productions. 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YOUNG PLAYWRIGHTS PROGRAM

Have you got an idea for a script that you want to develop, or are curious about where to start? This year we're offering a series of individual masterclasses led by professional playwrights. The Young Playwrights Program offers emerging writers the opportunity to be part of a collaborative network with other artists, turning a love of playwriting into a practice, and good ideas into great plays.

DYLAN VAN DEN BERG SHAPING STORIES FROM THE PAST

Award-winning writer and director Dylan Van Den Berg will lead a masterclass examining writing from personal or collective memory. This area of practice is incredibly valuable for any writer using true stories or collective memory as the basis of their writing.

Drawing on Dylan's powerful body of work including *Milk*, *Whitefella Yella Tree*, and *Ngadjung*, this masterclass will discuss practical techniques and tools as well as ethical considerations that are vital for the emerging playwright. Writers will be led through techniques that unravel how to shape the material of history into theatrical storytelling, whilst exploring the ethical responsibilities that should be considered when drawing on other people's or communities' experiences in your writing.



SAT 10 JUNE

HONOR WEBSTER-MANNISON QUEERING DRAMATURGY

This masterclass by Naarm/Melbourne-based playwright and performance-maker Honor Webster-Mannison will explore the creative practices and methodologies of contemporary queer performance: the kind that has exploded and ruined the carpet, that will haunt you for a little while after, that is all blurry and rageful and something else.

This masterclass will be useful for artists who want to make work which resists traditional narratives, uses feeling and intuition as structural devices, and embeds the personal within the political and social.
