WELCOME TO 2024

2024 is all about creating more space for young people.

In advance of the centenary renovations due to commence this year at Gorman Arts Centre, we have recently moved across the courtyard to B-Block to create an inclusive space for young artists to call their own. Our new home includes a dedicated rehearsal and workshop studio, room for emerging artists to develop their own projects, and a shared social space to bring our community together. This transformative move is part of a shared vision between Canberra Youth Theatre and Arts Capital to make Gorman Arts Centre a more vibrant, welcoming, creative arts community, and continue its cultural legacy.

There is space to rehearse, to write, to meet, to share a meal, and have a chat. There is space to dream – and a space to make those dreams a reality. We want this space to be a dynamic hub of creativity, community, and possibilities, designed for and driven by young people, with more opportunities than ever to get involved. It's your space, so come hang out – that's where the best ideas come from.

Our first production for the year is going to work up a sweat! Winner of the 2022 Emerging Playwright Commission, *Work, But This Time Like You Mean It* by Honor Webster-Mannison is a crazy, deep-fryer-dive into the surreal world of young people's experiences in the workplace. *The Department of Responsible Adulting* will be an immersive, site-specific performance that takes audiences into the belly of a new government department run entirely by children.



Our Emerging Artists program is evolving to meet the needs of our thriving creative community. We are in the business of opening doors for artists, starting with our own. Open Studio will offer free, flexible studio space for emerging artists to develop their own work on their own terms. Emerge **Company** is taking another bold leap forward, presenting a new devised work at Canberra Theatre Centre. Emerging Creatives offers hands-on training in design, stage management, and all things backstage, which this year, we're thrilled to be delivering in partnership with NIDA. A new program, Creative Leaders, will develop the leadership skills for emerging artists ready to drive cultural change. We're offering Masterclasses in **Directing** and **Auditions**, and a platform to share new work at our **Scratch** nights. Young Critics is focused on adding more young voices to the conversations about the work appearing on our stages. Writers Ensemble is a new program that offers workshops for writers interested in theatre, and performers interested in writing, delivered by some of Australia's leading playwrights. And we continue to launch the careers of new writers with our Emerging Playwright Commission.

Our weekly **Ensembles** workshops continue to offer young artists the opportunity to progress from exciting first steps, through to advanced performance techniques, in a spirit of creativity and collaboration. We are deepening our collaboration with the **Education** sector to support local teachers, offering experiential learning programs that inspire students with a passion for theatre and the arts.

2024 will be a game-changer in the future of our company. New space. New programs. New works. A new chapter in our story. What else is happening in 2024?

Watch this space.

The Department of Responsible Adulting is an inventive, anarchic, immersive new work created by Canberra Youth Theatre that will promote intergenerational conversations and empower young people. Literally. They have lanyards.



Open Studio is a creative development residency for emerging artists who need space to create a new work, develop an idea, or rehearse a project.

Residents in Open Studio will have access to free space in our rehearsal studio throughout the year, either spread-out over several weeks, or used in intense bursts, depending on what's most effective for you.

Scratch is for performers, writers and theatre-makers who are itching to share ambitious ideas, make new connections, and take their creative projects to the next stage.

EMERGING PLAYWRIGHT COMMISSION

The Emerging Playwright Commission offers a professional commission to an emerging Australian playwright aged 16–35, to create a new full-length work that brings the voices and stories of youth to the stage.

This commission places emerging playwrights at the centre of the creative process, and is specifically designed to springboard writers at a crucial point in their career. Now in its third year, this commission attracts submissions from all over Australia, connecting our young artists to a nationwide network of emerging writers.

The winning playwright leads a series of creative workshops with young artists from our community, who play an essential role in the play's development. These workshops are free to participate in, and will be announced throughout the year.

The winner of the 2023 Emerging Playwright Commission is **Sonia Dodd** for her play, *How to Destroy the Beep Test in Five Days*.

Applications for the 2024 commission will close on 3 June 2024.

YEARS 1 - 3

Discover the joy of theatre. Young artists will free their imagination and gain confidence to create their own stories. They will build skills in collaboration and creative problem solving, working as a group to devise an original piece of theatre. This introduction to performance enables young artists to find their voice through the power of creative play.

YEARS 4 - 6

Explore the foundations of theatre-making and performance. Young artists develop their skills in improvisation, creating characters, devising, voice, movement, collaboration, and creative thinking. These workshops provide young people with a space to express themselves, encounter different performance styles, and share their stories.

YEARS 7 - 9

Develop a toolkit for creating theatre. Young artists collaborate with professional theatre-makers to sharpen their skills in acting, improvisation, devising, script analysis, character development and stagecraft. Through a practical exploration of performance techniques, young artists amplify their creative voice and take ownership of their craft.

YEARS 10 - 12

Build your own pathway towards a creative practice. Young artists delve deeper into the theatrical process, exploring performance techniques and methodologies that further their skills in acting, devising, voice, movement, stagecraft, monologues, and scene work. Young artists perform scenes from plays, devise their own works, and develop their craft as emerging theatre-makers.
