CREATING CHARACTERS

Transforming into different characters is at the heart of drama, it's also the part that's the most fun! This workshop invites students to bring their imagination to life by developing their very own characters, learning how our voices, bodies and gestures tell the story of who we are. Through a range of exciting practical exercises, participants will explore movement, voice, and character development, all while building confidence, working together, and finding their creative voice.

- Critical and creative thinking skills by delving into character development. They will examine how different character elements affect audience perceptions by creating their own characters and considering the impact of their choices.

CREATIVE PLAY AND STORYTELLING

Empower your students through story. Building on participants' innate creativity, this workshop uses storytelling as a vehicle to explore elements of drama. Students will engage their body and voice to express their imagination, and collaborate as a group to bring their stories to the stage. This workshop teaches students how to work together to tell stories that communicate their ideas and experiences.

VOICE AND NOVEMENT

Children should be seen and heard! This workshop dives into the world of theatrical movement and vocalisation. Through tailored exercises, students develop vocal techniques and the use of the diaphragm, experimenting with different sounds that can be harnessed for a variety of theatrical purposes. Physical exercises guide students through the different elements of movement, including pacing, gesture, space, and time. These exercises equip young artists with a toolbox of techniques to step into any character or role.

- Knowledge of how to warm up the voice and body for performance.
- Understanding of how voice and movement can affect mood and atmosphere.
- Critical and creative thinking skills by reflecting on audience impact and how meaning is transferred to an audience.
